Upper Canada Village is world-renowned for its meticulously preserved heritage structures vividly brought to life by knowledgeable and welcoming staff. Open since 1961, Upper Canada Village features many buildings relocated as part of the St. Lawrence Seaway project. It is a designated site of Provincial Heritage Significance in Ontario.

## LEARNING CENTRES



**Discovery Centre:** Exhibits setting the context for your visit, including the War of 1812 and history of the settlement along the St. Lawrence River.

**Crysler Hall:** Exhibits featuring the stories and experiences of local Black people in Eastern Ontario from the 1780s to the 1960s.

**Croil Barn:** Exhibits presenting the development of agricultural technology, rural life and leisure in the last half of the 19th century.


**Signal Tower:** Learn about long-distance communication in the 1860s and see an elevated view of the Village.


Family Activity Centre: Open daily July & August. Hands-on activities for the whole family.
