ABOUT UPPER CANADA VILLAGE

Upper Canada Village is world-renowned for its meticulously preserved heritage structures vividly brought to life by knowledgeable and welcoming staff. Skilled artisans, working mills, and beautiful landscapes immerse you in the day-to-day activities of a rural village in 1860s Ontario. Open since 1961, Upper Canada Village features many buildings relocated as part of the St. Lawrence Seaway project. It is a designated site of Provincial Heritage Significance in Ontario.

LEARNING CENTRES

Discovery Centre: Exhibits setting the context for your visit, including the War of 1812 and history of the settlement along the St. Lawrence River.

Crysler Hall: Exhibits featuring the stories and experiences of local Black people in Eastern Ontario from the 1780s to the 1960s.

Croil Barn: Exhibits presenting the development of agricultural technology, rural life and leisure in the last half of the 19th century.

Signal Tower: Learn about long-distance communication in the 1860s and see an elevated view of the Village.

Family Activity Centre: Open daily July & August. Hands-on activities for the whole family.

Battle of Cryslers Farm Memorial Building: Museum dedicated to the Battle of Cryslers Farm on November 11, 1813 and the War of 1812. Stroll up to the monument and enjoy the panoramic view of the river.

Discover items crafted by our talented Village artisans: freshly baked bread, milled flour, wool blankets or yarn, tinware, and more in our extensive gift shop, featuring clothing, jewelry, kitchenware, candles, nostalgic candy, and unique Canadian-made treasures.

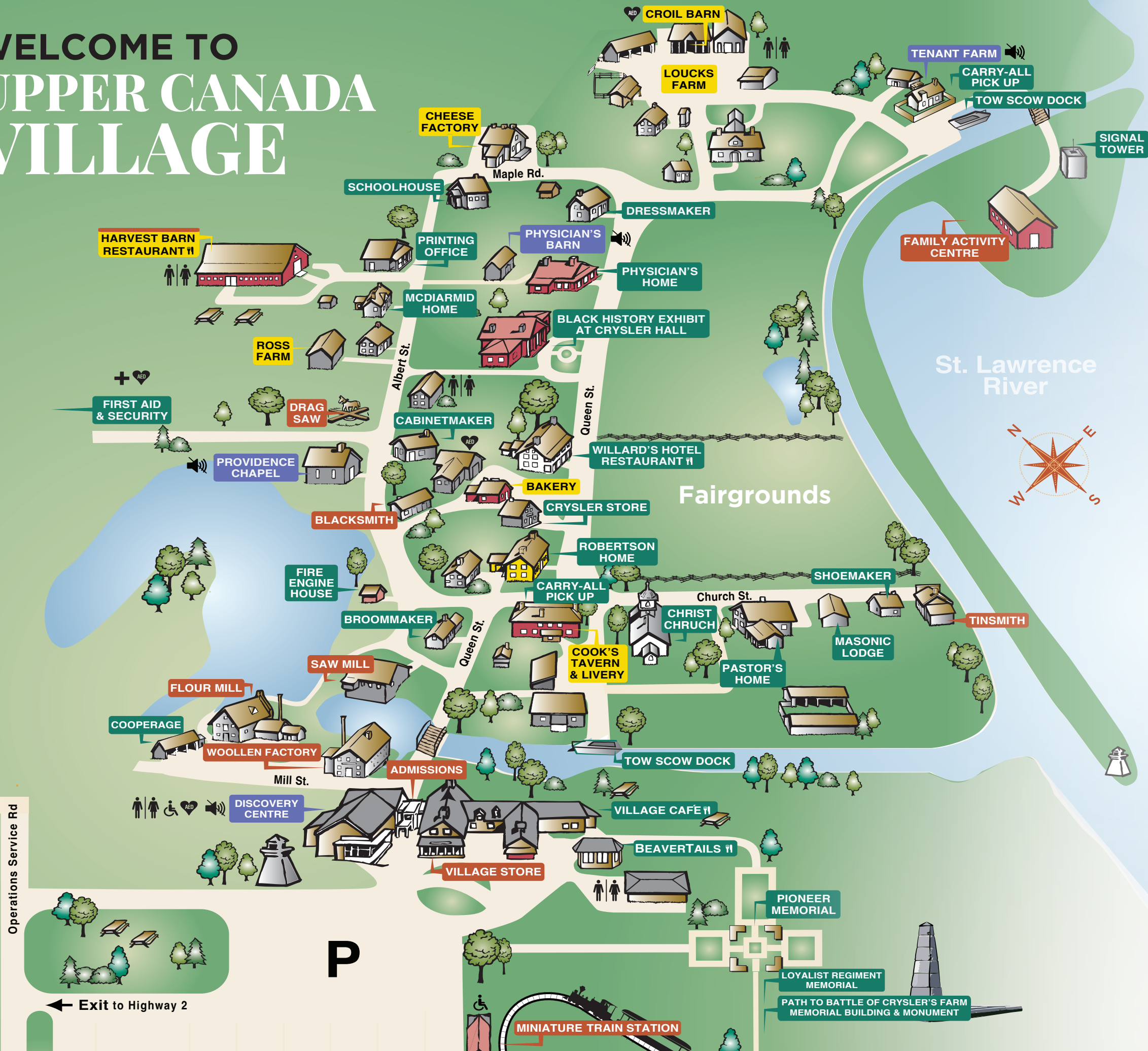
